Apart from providing policy input, she has served as a consultant in national and international agencies such as the Malaysian Productivity Corporation, MITI, the Ministry of Human Resources, and the Ministry of Higher Education as well as the United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (UNESCAP), Asian Development Bank, Asian Development Bank Institute, World Bank Institute, and the World Bank.
