He is also a Professorial Fellow at the Maastricht Economic and social Research and training centre on Innovation and Technology (MERIT), United Nations University. He obtained his doctorate in Economics from Cambridge University in 1992 and his research specialization includes science and technology policy, firm-level learning and innovation, healthcare services, foreign investment, cluster mapping and designing technology roadmaps. Among his recent books include *The New Political Economy of Southeast Asia*, 2010, Cheltenham: Edward Elgar (Edited with Johannes Dragbaek Schmidt) and *Innovation, Learning in Industrializing East Asia*, London: Routledge, 2011 (Edited with Thiruchelvam Kanagasundram and Keun Lee), *Innovation and Industrialization in Asia*, London: Routledge, 2012 (Edited with Yeo Lin and Yuri Sadoi), and *Evidence-based Development Economics: Essays in Honour of Sanjaya Lall*, Kuala Lumpur: University of Malaya Press, 2012 (Edited with Carlo Pietrobelli).
